This array of 1/4" and 3/8" drive handles surrounding a variety of sockets range from the 1920s up to 1978. No price available.



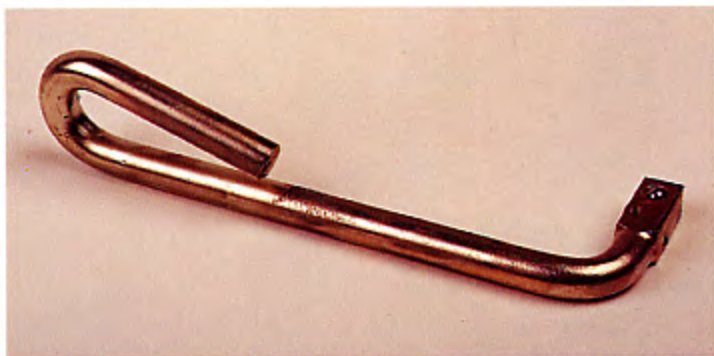
1945 Sliding tee handle. \$38.00



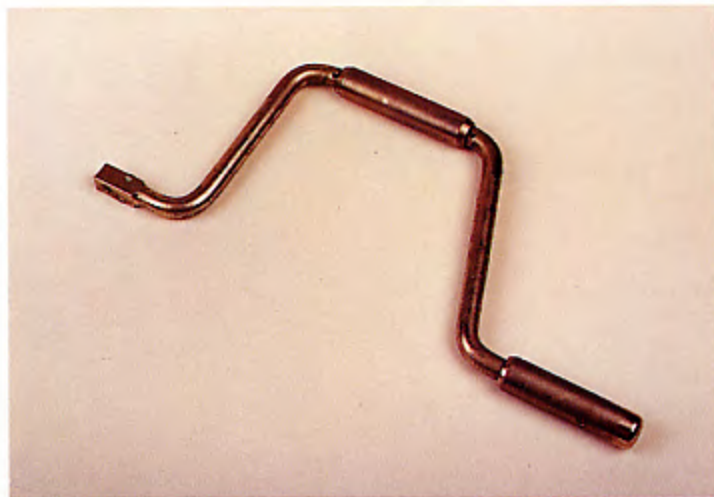
1947 breaker bar. \$47.00

This offset resembles the No. 1 offset from the early 1920s set, with the exception of the non-knurled end. \$47.00



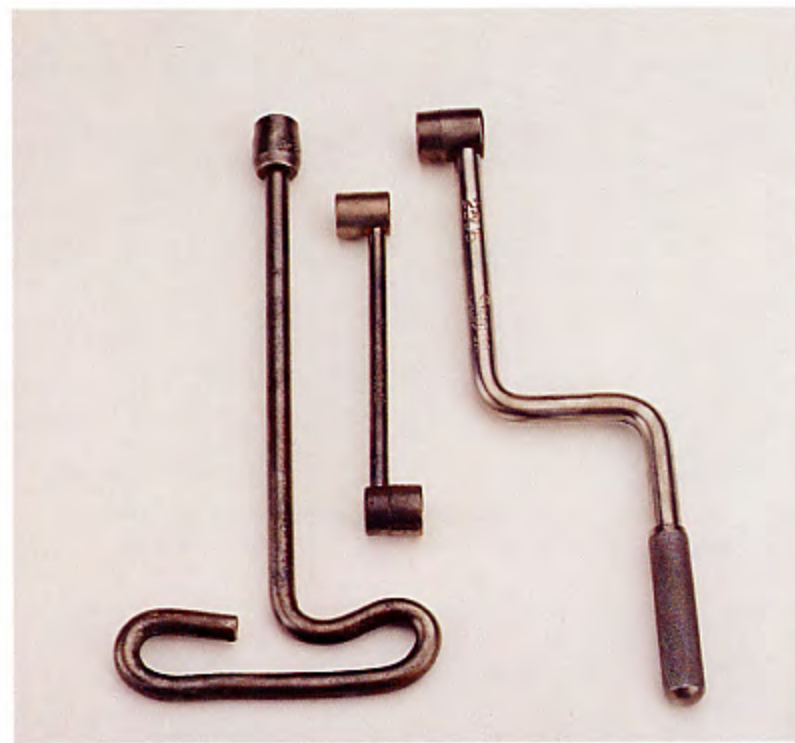
Brace or Rim. \$70-76

The three 1920s pieces pictured here have non-detachable ends. They have the Snap-on logo, no year mark, one alphabet and 2 numbers. They may have been a part of an automotive set. No price available.

Ratchets



An array of ratchets from the early years. From left to right, the ratchets shown in this picture date from the later 1920s and early 30s to the 1960s, covers drive sizes 1/4" 3/8", 1/2", have all forms of finish, are both military issue and standard, and are in good working condition! The ratchet at far left is a pop through ratchet—no year mark or patent number available, only the Snap-on logo. To reverse the ratcheting direction, the button is pushed out, the handle flipped over and the button reinserted. One side is OFF, the other side ON. This was the reversible ratchet. Some of the early reversible ratchets on them, like the 1932 ratchet, (third one pictured from the left) and came with a year mark. Price ranges for ratchets vary greatly from \$5 to \$350. Most ratchets

dating back from the 1940s are currently available in the same style, only the years and gears have changed. Improved versions have become a nice addition to the number of styles, colors and forms. For pricing of current available ratchets see the nearest Snap-on dealer. Most military issued hand tools from 1944 and 1945 are in large numbers and easy to find. Military hand tools carry a much smaller monetary value with price ranges between \$5 and \$25.

Ratchets such as this 1/2" drive pictured have not changed much over the last 50 years. A year mark page has been inserted in the front of the book. Most ratchets have a year mark stamp on them around the ratchet head, in between the 'on', 'off' selectors and can be dated to the year. Price ranges vary based on condition, year, and type.
